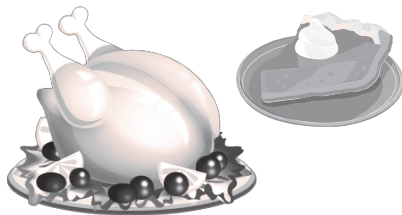

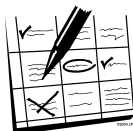
You will most likely see Fr. John or me at the 50-50 table or wandering around selling 50-50 tickets. Please buy a few from me or Fr. John -- it's good luck!

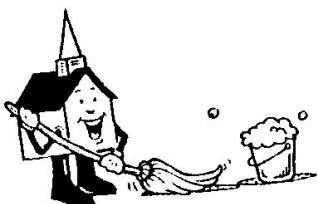

They have purchased everything that was on our wish list including some of the folding chairs that we had been asking for. Please, the next time you stop in for a meal, tell them how much we appreciate their generosity. 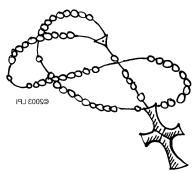

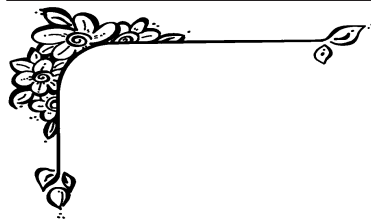
**Christian Service & Health Care Ministries**

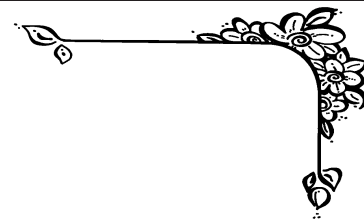
